

**Thank you for 6 months of progress in Haiti**



Dear Lincoln/Lancaster County Habitat for Humanity:

Six months after a devastating 7.0 earthquake struck near Port-au-Prince, Haitian families are benefiting from your tremendous support. I want to thank you for answering the call of these families in their great time of need through your generous donation of \$10,000. By contributing to Habitat for Humanity's disaster program, you are doing more than helping Haitians rebound from tragedy; you are doing God's work. My team and I will pray for the success of your work for the people of Lincoln/Lancaster County and congratulate your latest "green build" for Mr. Tuan Le's family in Lincoln.

With your help, we have made significant progress in our goal to serve 50,000 families. Since January 12, 2010, we count the following among our accomplishments:

- More than 21,000 emergency shelter kits assembled and delivered to our distribution partners
- More than 2,000 structural damage assessments conducted
- Up to 70 transitional shelters per week currently being built (nearly 400 to-date)
