**Everybody's Talking!** No pain, no gain: Fathers-to-be who would like to know what their partners go through when giving birth can now attend a special pain clinic at a hospital in eastern China. Nurses at the Aima Maternity Hospital hook up electric shock pads to the abdomens of expectant dads that simulate labor pains. Wu Ningzing, general manger at the hospital, explains that the Pain Experience Camp, as it is called, helps men to understand what labor is all about, and, in turn, be more supportive of their wives. One husband, Wu Jianlong, had a hard time handling the pain, but claimed that it made him realize what women go though, often for many hours, before the baby arrives.

**Happy ending:** There was a happy ending to what could have been a tragedy for a father and his two young sons who got lost in Expedition National Park in Queensland, Australia. Steven Van Lonkhuyzen, along with Ethan, age 7, and Timothy, age 5, were on a long road trip when their vehicle got stuck in a bog. When they didn't arrive at their destination, Van Lonkhuyzen's wife reported them missing. As the area is so vast, police asked for the public's help. A farmer remembered seeing the family's vehicle and contacted authorities. They were soon discovered, hungry, but otherwise in good shape.

**Alpaca pets:** It has long been known that pet therapy helps to raise the spirits of people who are confined to hospitals. Pet therapy usually includes dogs and cats, but another animal has proven to be a good choice at an elderly care facility in Berlin, Germany. The Mana Wedell Tagespflege uses the services of a group of alpacas, which are related to the camel. The animals live in the facility's garden and are looked after by caretakers, who bring them into residents' rooms to be petted. These gentle mammals are vaccinated and trained for their important role of enhancing the lives of the seniors living in the home.
