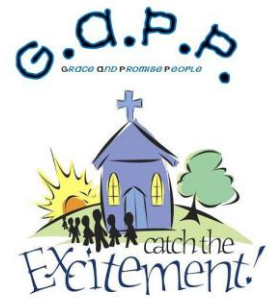


GAPP Facilitators Workshop Descriptions



The 9 Rotation Workshops are for Grade 3 and above. (Not all workshops are “open” during every rotation) Students of these ages meet in the Sanctuary for a gathering time before going to their assigned workshop room which is posted on the GAPP board in the GAPP hallway.

GAMES BY ST. JAMES

This is a large-muscle, “big space” room. Students use their whole bodies in the learning experience. Lessons might include “giant” game boards of traditional games, mazes, dance, treasure hunts, etc. This room will also be used for other “doing” activities, science experiments, guest presenters, etc.

GRACE AND GIGABYTES

The computer lab is equipped with the technology that makes Bible learning a multi-sensory experience. With the click of a mouse, stories appear and students enjoy a wide range of activities through interactive software programs, which offer stimulating graphics and animation.

SARAH’S OASIS

This “restful” desert room is the place for smaller groups to hear a Bible story in “first person” and ask questions such as Abraham visits or the Levite from the Good Samaritan story explains why he couldn’t help the injured man on the road Jericho.

THY WORD AND WORSHIP

This workshop is unique because of its diversity. At times more “traditional” classroom learning will take place. Bible skills and map work will happen here. Life-experience opportunities and discussion will happen here. Some rotations will include a “Matters of Faith” science workshop. This is the place where we study God’s word and “worship” in a variety of ways through life and learning.

MATTERS OF FAITH

In this science workshop we will experiment our way through the Bible. Students will enjoy a variety activities that relate to the story being studied.

“ACTS” OF THE APOSTLES

The puppet and drama workshop gives students the tools and opportunity to make Bible stories come alive. In this workshop dramas are created, staged, videotaped and viewed. Students experience the story more than once as it develops and unfolds. This workshop often provides us with “joyful noise!”

PROMISE PLEX THEATER

This is the place where students learn through the moving images of dramatic film and animation. Great Bible stories “come alive” as students watch quality presentations and then discuss them. Real movie theater seats and freshly popped popcorn give us that “real” movie theater feeling...smells great too!

THOU ART STUDIO

In our art studio we hope to move beyond arts and crafts. While we will enjoy crafts at times, we would like to incorporate art projects as an instructional experience. The children will create “works of art” to express their understanding of an aspect of the Bible story being studied. We will also appreciate and experience paintings and creations done by famous artists.

DAILY BREAD CAFÉ

In this kitchen workshop we will “eat” our way through the Bible. Students will enjoy cooking experiences related to the story being studied. Meals (such as soups or breads) may be prepared for families within our congregation or community as part of our teaching of service and outreach.

All classes are taught Sunday mornings at the 9:45am Education Hour
